Forestry EduTrainer distance blended learning will lead its attendees to the European Certificate for Forestry Trainers (ECFT): a qualification certificate designed from European standards, collecting the best practices and innovative tools for vocational training.

Finally, the ECFT will allow forestry trainers to improve their teaching and training skills in order to contribute to a better and enhanced training in the forestry sector.

It is known that highly qualified trainers contribute to Sustainable Forest Management. However, most of European countries lack a specific training to become a forestry trainer, especially concerning soft skills.

This is why Forestry EduTrainer aims at creating a distance blended learning for future Forestry trainers, through a Distance Learning Platform.

Intellectual Outputs:

Different steps will lead to the development of the ECFT:

- ▶ COMPETENCE STANDARD,
- ▶ TRAINING STANDARD,
- ▶ TRAINING PROGRAMME,
- ▶ DISTANCE LEARNING PLATFORM.

Main results:

The European Certificate of Forestry Trainer, and the annexed tools developed to issue it, will allow:

- ▶ Beginner forestry trainers to benefit from a specific training, designed from European common standards, to acquire, improve and perfect the necessary teaching and pedagogical skills to properly train forestry workers.
- ▶ Individual candidates who wish to become forestry trainers, to benefit from a specific training to become forestry trainers and to work in all those forestry centres that recognise the ECFT.
- ▶ Forestry VET centres and other organisations that employ forestry trainers to dispose from a new training course to improve the teaching and training skills of their trainers.
